Victoria in 1973 & started his teaching career in Kitamat B.C. with his first wife Gill.

After 2 years Ted returned to the Cowichan Valley and taught high school at Cowichan Senior Secondary until his retirement in 2009. Ted received his Masters Degree for Administrative Curriculum in 1995, at Gonzaga University in Washington State.

Throughout Ted's tenure as a teacher he spent countless hours & weekends coaching basketball (senior boys team). His passion was basketball and coaching. Ted started the summer basketball hoop camp with the goal of igniting a love of the game in young players and also as a very successful fund raiser for the team.
