John was born in Fredericton, New Brunswick and moved to Halifax, Nova Scotia as a young child. He joined the Canadian Navy as a young man and proudly served his country throughout his career. He retired after a 38 year distinguished career and commissioning from the ranks of Chief ERA First Class retiring as a Lieutenant in Victoria B.C.

He served on many H.M.C. Ships on both coasts and sailed the world.
