I remember when we went in for afternoon shift,the custom would be for Lyle and Oscar Lukasch and me to stand at the bottom of the crane,where Lyle would tell stories and some jokes,some were good and some were very corny,yet it became a tradition that I looked forward to!

As for Lyle being kind ,he would bring in food to feed the the crows.They trusted him so much that they would eat the food from his hand,provided he did not look at them. What the crows did when he had days off and finally retired I do not know.

Things have come full circle now,I am the senior man on the crew and I try to treat the other crew members as Lyle treated me,with respect,and as equals as he treated me. The one thing I do not do is

feed the crows,as the crane is no longer there and I would not have the patience that Lyle possessed!
I think of the stories Lyle would tell of the trips to Saskatchewan,with Blanche to visit family members,
the good times that they had.

At times I would see Lyle downtown,and he would stop and always have time to speak with me,asking
how I was and how the mill was doing.
